 3 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, Mr Beer.  
 4 MR BEER: Good morning, sir. Could we call, please,  
 5 Marina Schofield.  
 6 MS MARINA SCHOFIELD (sworn)  
 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs Schofield. Would you like to  
 8 sit down or are you happier standing up?  
 9 **A. I will stand up.**  
 10 THE CHAIRMAN: Certainly.  
 11 Questions from MR BEER  
 12 MR BEER: Mrs Schofield, my name is Jason Beer, I am counsel  
 13 to the Inquiry. I am going to ask you in a moment to  
 14 read a statement that you have prepared in relation to  
 15 Anthony. I think there is a copy of the statement in  
 16 large font available. In your own time, please read the  
 17 statement.  
 18 **A. My name is Marina Schofield, I am the mother of**  
 19 **Anthony Paul Grainger who was shot in the chest by**  
 20 **an officer from Greater Manchester Police on**  
 21 **3 March 2012. My beautiful boy was born on**  
 22 **26 January 1976. I loved him from the moment I saw him.**  
 23 **I was 17 years old at the time. My mother had died when**  
 24 **I was 12 and I was brought up by my dad along with my**  
 25 **brother. My dad played a big part and helped me bring**

1 up Anthony. I had three other children, Natalie, Stuart  
 2 and Michael. Natalie died when she was nine hours old.  
 3 Anthony loved being a big brother to Stuart and  
 4 Michael. When Anthony was six years old I split up from  
 5 his father. Anthony helped me raise his two brothers.  
 6 When he was 15 to 16 years old he started to get  
 7 into trouble due to being friends with a bad crowd. He  
 8 was addicted to cars, he should have been a rally car  
 9 driver. Unfortunately he began to steal cars for  
 10 a joyride. When he was 16 he was sent to HMPYOI Stoke  
 11 Heath, when he came home he seemed to turn a corner  
 12 after meeting the love of his life, Rachel.  
 13 Unfortunately this only lasted until their relationship  
 14 broke down in 2002 and my granddaughter was born and  
 15 Anthony adored her. Stuart and Michael loved having  
 16 a niece.  
 17 In 2004 I married John. Anthony was the best man  
 18 and his daughter was a flower girl. Anthony was the  
 19 most loving and caring person and was made to be a dad.  
 20 He was fantastic with children, even the neighbourhood  
 21 kids loved him.  
 22 For a while after [redacted] was born Anthony kept  
 23 his nose clean. He had his driving licence and his own  
 24 car. When his daughter was one he started to have  
 25 problems with his kidneys and when she was five he had

1 to have a transplant. He used to tell her the scar was  
 2 from a shark bite. In 2007 his son was born and he was  
 3 ecstatic. Three years later his relationship broke down  
 4 with their mother and she moved to Carlisle. He would  
 5 try and see his children as often as possible.  
 6 Anthony was a fantastic dad. He used to go to  
 7 Carlisle to see his kids every weekend. If they ever  
 8 wanted anything he would do his best to provide it.  
 9 I remember once his daughter wanting a puppy, Anthony  
 10 found the puppy she wanted straight away and was up in  
 11 Carlisle that afternoon meeting her from school with  
 12 a new puppy as a surprise.  
 13 I am worried about the Inquiry will affect the  
 14 children, until now they have been shielded from  
 15 publicity but I expect that the incident will now be in  
 16 the newspapers and I worry as to how I can protect them  
 17 from this --  
 18 THE CHAIRMAN: Don't worry.  
 19 **A. -- asked me why a policeman shot her dad when the police**  
 20 **are there to protect us. It is not easy to answer**  
 21 **questions like that. Anthony had always worked with**  
 22 **cars. He had known Colin Waters 20 years, they worked**  
 23 **from the same yard for as many years as I can remember.**  
 24 **I am not sure what their working arrangement was and**  
 25 **whether they were partners or whether they operated**

1 separately, but certainly Anthony used to be busy  
 2 driving a recovery wagon and buying and selling car  
 3 parts. He would recover vehicles after accidents and  
 4 did a lot of trading on the internet.  
 5 Anthony started to get in trouble again after the  
 6 children moved to Carlisle. He started to withdraw from  
 7 me and John during this time. I believe it was because  
 8 he didn't want to cause us any hassle with the police as  
 9 a result of his dealings with them. I last spoke to  
 10 Anthony at Christmas time in 2011. I know he did speak  
 11 to John a few more times before his death.  
 12 On 3 March 2012, six police officers came to my  
 13 house, it was approximately 11.35 pm. They told me that  
 14 Anthony had been shot in Culcheth by police. My whole  
 15 world fell apart. All I could think about was how I am  
 16 going to tell his two young children that their daddy  
 17 was gone forever and that the police did it. My son  
 18 will never see his children grow up or walk his daughter  
 19 down the aisle. I have since been diagnosed with post  
 20 traumatic stress disorder. I am currently waiting to  
 21 see a counsellor, I look at his photograph every night  
 22 and I cannot believe that he is not here anymore.  
 23 No mother should have to bury their own child,  
 24 I have always said. I have days when I struggle to move  
 25 on with my life, even thoughts of ending my own life to

<p>1 be with my son but I realise I have to fight for justice 2 for my son and my grandchildren. I cannot understand 3 how an unarmed man sat in a car in a quiet car park can 4 be shot by a police officer. To me it is murder and he 5 should not be working. We have had to pay Anthony's 6 funerals ourselves even though his life was taken from 7 him by Greater Manchester Police. I had to borrow the 8 money to cover these costs.</p> <p>9 This has ruined my life and I feel as if my heart 10 has been ripped out of me. I just want this nightmare 11 to end and Anthony to get the justice he deserves. It 12 has taken five years to get to this point where the 13 public Inquiry is due to start and has put an enormous 14 stress on me and John and the family. We also suffered 15 terribly when GMP leaked a copy of the IPCC report to 16 Manchester Evening News and it was published in the 17 paper before we were even aware of the contents.</p> <p>18 I am left with a deep distrust of the police, I am 19 scared of them and even moved away from my address that 20 I have lived in for many years because of worries about 21 harassment. I remain worried that they will harass me 22 once the Inquiry finishes.</p> <p>23 MR BEER: Mrs Schofield, thank you very much indeed. 24 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs Schofield. 25 Can I just briefly address the lady -- I think you</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 5</p>	<p>1 MR BEER: I think this morning Mr Thomas provided his client 2 with a copy of the statement to read and unfortunately 3 the copy provided included the names in it. 4 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. 5 MR BEER: It is completely inadvertent. 6 THE CHAIRMAN: We are going to do our best to make sure it 7 doesn't go on the website and I should be grateful in 8 that particular detail is not included. 9 Thank you very much, I am most grateful to you for 10 your cooperation. 11 MR THOMAS: Sir, there is one second statement that is the 12 identification statement that needs to be read. 13 A short. 14 MR BEER: I don't think it is necessary for Mrs Schofield to 15 read the identification statement. 16 THE CHAIRMAN: That can be taken as read insofar as it is 17 necessary. 18 MR THOMAS: So be it. 19 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Ms Thomas. 20 MR BEER: Ms Gail Hadfield-Grainger, please. 21 MS GAIL HADFIELD-GRAINGER (sworn) 22 THE CHAIRMAN: Pause, take a breath. 23 Ms Hadfield-Grainger, would you be more comfortable 24 sitting down? 25 <b>A. <p>1 are a press representative. 2 A MEMBER OF THE PRESS: Yes. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: The intention was there should be no 4 reference to the names of either of Mr Grainger's 5 children and there has been an inadvertent reference to 6 the name of one of them. I should be grateful if the 7 names would not be included in any report of this 8 hearing. 9 MR THOMAS: Sir, I was about to ask you the same thing. 10 A MEMBER OF THE PRESS: That is fine by me. The names are 11 in some of the statements that have gone on to the 12 website, are they not? 13 THE CHAIRMAN: I think they have been redacted, but that 14 brings me to the next topic which is that when the 15 transcript of today's hearing is uploaded, I propose 16 that any anyone inadvertent reference to the names of 17 either of the children should be redacted. 18 MR BEER: Yes, sir -- 19 THE CHAIRMAN: Does anybody have any objection to that, it 20 seems to be the right course to adopt? 21 MR THOMAS: Yes, sir. 22 MR BEER: It is entirely inadvertent, what had happened was 23 that Farleys had requested that we redact the names out. 24 We did. 25 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 6</p>	<p>1 THE CHAIRMAN: Are you sure? All right. 2 Questions from MR BEER 3 MR BEER: Ms Hadfield-Grainger, my name is Jason Beer and 4 I am counsel to the Inquiry. I think there is 5 a statement that the usher is going to hand to you. 6 That is your statement about Anthony. Could you please 7 read it to the court, thank you. 8 <b>A. It is not easy to stand in front of strangers and 9 describe the love that Anthony and I shared. I dreamt 10 of doing that in front of our loved ones at our wedding 11 and I never thought that I would have to do this in 12 a courtroom because of the way that Anthony was killed. 13 It is difficult to find the words to explain how 14 much we loved each other. The best way that I can 15 describe it is to read a poem that Anthony wrote for me 16 in 2012 on Valentine's day. 17 Sorry. 18 "You are all of my beautiful dreams, the best I have 19 ever had, you are my secure when I am afraid and a smile 20 on my face when I am sad. 21 "You are in every single thing I do and in every 22 single step I take, you are the soul of this body of 23 mine, the breath from which I take ..." 24 I can't even see. 25 THE CHAIRMAN: Take your time.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 8</p>

1 A. Anthony did not find it easy to write, especially about  
 2 his feelings, so this Valentine's card will always mean  
 3 the world to me. I have had this poem tattooed on me so  
 4 these words will never leave me and I will be able to  
 5 take them to the grave for when we are together again.  
 6 Anthony and I fell in love back in 2009 and then we  
 7 began to live together with my two children  
 8 in October 2011. Anthony was very much a family man and  
 9 he was great, a great help to me and my children and  
 10 great around the house. I grew to know and love  
 11 Anthony, not just as my life partner but as a loving  
 12 father to my children.  
 13 When I used to -- when I was breastfeeding my  
 14 daughter Anthony would just sit beside us and stroke her  
 15 head until she fell to sleep, and then as his children  
 16 got older we spent the days out together. There was  
 17 days at Diggerland where Anthony tried to build my  
 18 daughter a princess castle out of mud and a trip to  
 19 Knowsley Safari Park because my son wanted to see  
 20 meercats.  
 21 On one of our trips to Blackpool the seafront became  
 22 covered in bubbles because a shipment of Fairy liquid  
 23 came apart and the kids loved it.  
 24 When the children got restless, Anthony would take  
 25 them to a soft play centre and he would run around like

1 a big kid with them.  
 2 I grew to love Anthony, also through the love of his  
 3 own children. He was very much a part of their life.  
 4 He got up every weekend to drive and see them, to see  
 5 his son and daughter in Cumbria and when it used to be  
 6 snowing up there he would send a picture of the  
 7 mountains to me from his phone.  
 8 In the month before Anthony died, we had been  
 9 viewing houses with enough room for six of us. We were  
 10 also trying for a baby together and we had already  
 11 chosen the names, they were going to be called Bobby and  
 12 Frankie. We chose two names because there are twins on  
 13 both sides of my family so we were kind of hoping to  
 14 have twins and we used to joke that we would need  
 15 a minibus.  
 16 Anthony came home on one evening and told me that he  
 17 had found a church where he wanted us to get married.  
 18 He took me to see it and it was so beautiful. We were  
 19 just standing there looking at it together, talking  
 20 about how we had the rest of our lives together.  
 21 Anthony could be quiet in company but when it was  
 22 just us two he talked a lot and he had a brilliant sense  
 23 of humour. He was always there for me and we would text  
 24 each other throughout the day every single day. Until  
 25 this day I still look at my phone waiting for him to

1 ring.  
 2 On the day that Anthony had been killed -- was  
 3 killed, he was playing computer games with my son and  
 4 talking about boy stuff. When Anthony went out he  
 5 paused the game and he told my son that he would finish  
 6 it later that day. So after Anthony went out, I had my  
 7 son practice for the game because he wanted to impress  
 8 Anthony for when he got back. My son went to bed that  
 9 night with a game console in his hand, wondering why  
 10 Anthony had not come back home to play.  
 11 So later I bought a dog to help my son deal with the  
 12 grief and my son decided to name it after the game they  
 13 were playing, and called it Carbon. I've got a photo  
 14 album at home which is very important to me. It has got  
 15 photographs of Anthony doing all sorts of things, like  
 16 when he went to see Harry Potter with my friends, having  
 17 pillow fights with the kids in the house and when he won  
 18 a prize at Blackpool for my son.  
 19 I also have a special box in which I have Anthony's  
 20 things, little pieces of paper which have got his  
 21 handwriting on, his clothes that were in the washing  
 22 basket on the day that he died. A little bracelet that  
 23 he bought for me when he was out with the kids in  
 24 Cumbria and his trainers.  
 25 They are all the things that I have left of him,

1 along with my memories. No matter what Anthony will  
 2 never be forgotten.  
 3 Thank you.  
 4 MR BEER: Thank you very much.  
 5 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Ms Hadfield-Grainger.  
 6 MR BEER: Sir, that is all of the evidence for today, indeed  
 7 for this week.  
 8 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.  
 9 MR BEER: We will next convene a fortnight on Tuesday in  
 10 open session at 10.30 am.  
 11 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.  
 12 MR BEER: We will next convene in closed session this  
 13 Tuesday coming at 10.30 am.
